## The Framework to Negotiations.

This August, **Darren Haskell**, FSMC President and **Rebecca Reid**, Regional Director-General, DFO Pacific, signed *Nesika Oakut ("Our Own Way")*: A Framework Agreement to Guide the Negotiations for Managing Fraser River Salmon.

The purpose of the Framework is to guide the conduct of both DFO and FSMC during negotiations.


"There are specific responsibilities and procedures in the *Framework* that both parties must follow," Darren said.
"For example, process timelines and schedules will be in place. Agendas will be confirmed 10 calendar days in advance of meetings between DFO and FSMC negotiators."

In the *Framework*, First
Nations and the department
confirm their commitment to

work together on a government-to-government basis. "It's a step towards building a respectful and cooperative relationship between DFO and FSMC," said Tina Donald (Vice-President, FSMC).

Developing collaborative decision-making processes, structures and resources is part of the scope of the Framework. Indeed, FSMC's current Mandate, as approved by Council Resolutions from its member nations, is to negotiate Management Agreement #1, at the heart of which, is a proposed government-to-government joint management structure.

The FSMC Negotiations
Team will soon convene,
with an eye towards
meeting their counterparts
from DFO in November.
