- What is an "Extraordinary Signatory Assembly"?
 Every meeting that isn't the Annual Signatory Assembly.

What is quorum at the Signatory Assemblies? - 60% of Member Delegates




My responsibility as a Member Delegate is to:

- Attend and participate in Signatory Assemblies
 Decide on thy consensus or vate) on resolutions at the Signatory Assemblies
 Roccive annual financial statements and other information releasant to FSM.
 Appoint Member Delegates from my area to sit on the Main Table.

- Discuss and approve Draft Mandates as they are
- presented to the Assembly
 Seek Formal Mandates from my First Nation as
- Consider and approve amendments to the FSMC

 Communicate FSMC information regularly to my First Nation.

If consensus cannot be achieved then a vote is held.

Ordinary Resolutions

Special Resolutions

If the resolution is for approving very sensitive matters like negotiation mandates, removing a Main Table member, or amending the Constitution and Bylaws then a very high bar for approval is set. These resolutions are called Special Resolutions.

The objective of the FSMC is to prepare for, negotiate, and implement an agreement for the joint management of Fraser River salmon. (Constitution)


PRINCIPLES


