Background and Introduction:

The Fraser Salmon Collaborative Management Agreement (FSCMA), signed on July 5, 2019 by the President of the Fraser Salmon Management Council (FSMC) and Minister of Fisheries & Oceans Canada (DFO), is intended to create, promote and support government-to-government, nation-to-nation structures for the collaborative governance and management and conservation of Fraser Salmon. In support of this, the FSCMA establishes a joint collaborative management structure for the Parties including an Executive, Fraser Salmon Management Board, and Joint Technical Committee.

As laid out in the FSCMA the FSMB, and their JTC, are guided in their work by their Annual Workplans. These workplans are developed collaboratively with an objective of refining the scope laid out within Section 2.1 of the Agreement to identify the priority items the FSMB and JTC will take on in any given year, recognizing the available resources and capacity available to the process. The workplans cover the period from April 1st to March 31st and, as a result, are therefore intended to be finalized on or before March 31st to inform the coming year's work.

The 2024-2025 workplan will cover four key areas of work as follows.

Goal:

Develop Chinook fisheries management measures that achieve identified conservation objectives and provide for priority access for food, social and ceremonial fisheries.

Measurable Accomplishment (S.M.A.R.T) Objective(s)

- 1. Long Term Management Objective Development: Develop recommendations for quantitative fishery management targets and objectives for Fraser Chinook stocks to guide management actions in all fisheries. Focus on Summer 5₂ Management Unit, with other Fraser Chinook stocks to be considered and added to workplan as agreed upon by the FSMB.
- 2. *Post-season Fishery Review:* Post-season review of fishery impacts on Fraser Chinook. Analyze data and relevant information to reach a shared understanding of the outcomes of fishery management actions and tools implemented, reviewed against the fishery management targets and objectives in place for the fishery.
- 3. *Pre-season Fishery Planning:* Review outputs from fishery management planning tools, including projections of impacts/outcomes and uncertainties, against identified fishery management targets and objectives. Develop annual recommendations for fishery management actions to meet objectives and targets.
- 4. *Tools and Approaches:* Review tools, methods and research to support management and assessment of Fraser Chinook fisheries.
- 5. Develop/update 3-year workplan for Fraser Chinook.
- 6. Develop Mark-Selective Fisheries review process. Develop expectations for evaluating existing and new pilot Chinook MSF opportunities.
- 7. Understand the Chilliwack Summer 5₂ Chinook enhancement program's influence on Fraser Summer 5₂ management objectives, targets, and fishery impacts.
