## Steps taken toward Renewal

West Coast Aquatic Review highlighted following:

- Context for Fraser Salmon management has changed because of shift towards cogovernance and co-management
- DFO and First Nations have different areas of focus
  - DFO primarily focused on annual operational delivery of fisheries
  - Nations focused on holistic conservation of salmon and the ecosystem for 7 generations



# Strengths and Areas for Renewal

### Strengths

- Collaborative discussions and relationship building
- Joint Technical Working Group support

### Areas for renewal

- Clarity on Forum objectives and FSCMA structures
- Transparency and what was heard follow-up for First Nations
- Establish lead times for effective preparation & delivery for Forums



### Recommendations

- Define FSMC and FSMB roles, responsibilities, and relationship to Forums
- Develop clear connection between Forum discussions and outcomes for co-management and co-governance
- Create communications & feedback mechanisms for follow-up with First Nations
- Strengthen processes for regional planning
- Refine and define the JTWG role and purpose
  for Forums

## Renewal Workshop – January 2025

Forum participation is not as robust as it once was because people aren't really seeing much of a value or impact, especially since most fisheries are in decline and fishing opportunities have become less & less

Some rational for this is:

- too much focus on information sharing vs strategic, actionable and mindful discussions
- a need for enhanced engagement on key priorities & concerns
- a lack of clarity on roles, responsibilities and decision-making processes of involved Parties
- disconnect between Forum discussions and actual fisheries comanagement decisions
- need to better communicate and engage with those First Nations yet to sign onto the FSMC / CMA



## Renewal Workshop – January 2025

There is also:

- Recognition that First Nations technical capacity has grown and there is improved capacity for strategic discussions at Forum
- Interest in shifting DFO's role of presenter of information to a collaborative workshop partner
- Need to redefine Forum from both DFO and First Nations perspectives



## Ideas for Renewal

- Focus on priorities, strategy development, and collaborative decision-making processes
- Include FSMC regional caucus sessions at Forum
- Improve linkages between Forum discussions and FSMC/JTC work
- Increase transparency and communication of comanagement & co-governance outcomes and decisions
- Create briefing note processes to Forum through regional AAROMs
- Provide opportunities for insertion of traditional knowledge at Forum
- Consider extending Forum to 4-5 days



### Forum Renewal Short-term Actions

Start with small changes this year:

- Add a FSMB process presentation (January)
- Consider Regional Tier 1 breakout meetings during Forum (February and/or April?)
- Improve integration with regional AAROMs
  processes
- Seek feedback on Forum purpose & objectives
- Commit to providing renewal updates throughout the Forum season

### Next Steps

- Provide renewal update at January Forum
- Add a Tier 1 discussion on renewal to January Forum agenda
- Work on new Forum purpose statement & objectives
- Explore options for restructuring Forum format
- Collect and bring renewal ideas to Forum Planning Committee
- Forum Renewal Team to meet regularly during the 2025-26 Forum cycle
